

Fundamentals for Establishing the Legal Affairs Committee of the Central Police University

Approved by Order *Tai-Nei-Jen-Tzu* No.207530 of the Ministry of the Interior on Jan.19, 1984

1. For the purpose of dealing with legal affairs, the University establishes the Legal Affairs Committee (hereinafter referred to as “the Committee”).
2. The Committee shall handle the following affairs:
 - (1) Preparation of the University’s legislation plans.
 - (2) Review and approval of enactment, amendment, and abolishment of the University’s regulations.
 - (3) Collation, registration, and control of the University’s legal documents.
 - (4) Edition and publication of the University’s regulations.
 - (5) Acceptance of the people’s claim for national compensation.
 - (6) Affairs assigned by the president.
3. The Committee sets a chief committeeman, which is assumed by the vice president on a part-time basis, to preside over the Committee.
4. The Committee sets 7~9 committeemen, which are assumed by the staff designated by the president on a part-time basis. The tenure of committeemen is 1 year, and they may be employed continuously upon expiration of the tenure.
5. The Committee sets an executive secretary to deal with day-to-day business under the direction of the chief committeeman, and a clerk to do the work assigned. Both of them shall be designated by the president within the university’s staff.
6. The chief committeeman shall call a meeting of the Committee once every 2 months, and may call temporary meetings where necessary.
7. Personnel of the related departments or experts may be invited to attend the Committee’s meetings.
8. No car fares or research expenses will be offered for the part-time personnel of the Committee, the personnel of the related departments, and the experts or scholars to deal with business or attend the meetings.
